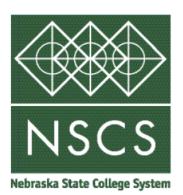

Non-Unionized Professional Staff. On July 1, 2013, each College and the System Office is authorized to provide a 2.0% salary increase to each non-union professional staff employee with satisfactory performance.

Non-Unionized Support Staff. On July 1, 2013, each College and the System Office is authorized to provide a 2.0% salary increase to each non-union support staff employee with satisfactory performance on July 1, 2013. No service date salary adjustments will be provided.

Background Information:

NAPE/AFSCME Support Staff Employees. The NSCS-NAPE/AFSCME Bargaining <u>Agreement</u> was ratified by the NAPE/AFSCME membership on January 3, 2013. The Board approved the terms of the <u>Agreement</u> on January 15, 2013. The <u>Agreement</u> provides a 2.0% salary annual increase on July 1, 2013 and for incremental salary adjustments based on five, ten, fifteen and twenty years of service.

NSCPA Professional Staff Employees. All terms of the NSCS-NSCPA Bargaining <u>Agreement</u> were ratified by the NSCPA membership on January 10, 2013. The Board approved the terms of the <u>Agreement</u> on January 15, 2013. The <u>Agreement</u> provides for an \$835 annual increase on July 1, 2013. That amount was calculated by dividing a 2% salary pool increase among NSCPA members by virtue of FTE status.

SCEA Faculty Employees. All terms of the NSCS-SCEA Bargaining <u>Agreement</u> were ratified by the SCEA membership on January 10, 2013. The Board approved the terms of the <u>Agreement</u> on January 15, 2013. The Agreement provides for a 2.0% salary increase on July 1, 2013.

Recognition of Student Trustees

Vice Chair Suarez presented certificates of thanks and recognition to Morgan Nelson, CSC Student Trustee, Joseph Fauver, PSC Student Trustee and Madison Becker, WSC Student Trustee in acknowledgment of their service during the 2012-2013 academic year.

Presidents' Reports

PSC President Hanson said that personnel from PSC met recently with officials from the UNMC College of Nursing. That meeting resulted in the addition of 2 nursing RHOP positions from Peru at the Lincoln Center and 2 at the Omaha Center beginning as early as this fall. Additional meetings with the Allied Health group will be held soon to present a proposal for additional RHOP positions for Peru State.

President Hanson also noted that the PSC Higher Learning Commission (HLC) Self-Study report would be showcased at the HLC annual conference as an example to other colleges about how to draft such a document. Dr. Todd Drew, Vice President for Academic Affairs, would be providing advice to others going through the HLC self-study process. Dr. Hanson noted that he and Dr. Drew would be presenting the unique approach of combining the self-study and the PSC strategic planning process at the HLC annual conference as well.

Finally, President Hanson indicated the Institute for Community Engagement is engaged in Auburn at this time. Students from the senior capstone course are participating in focus groups with folks in Auburn to develop a branding and marketing strategy for the city. Other students are also working to create a national historic district in Auburn. Additionally, other capstone students are helping Auburn's Calvert Elementary students develop good health and nutrition habits.

WSC President Frye reported on the academic success of the WSC student athletes. Much of the success is due to the Athletic Academic Program. The program requires freshmen and transfer student athletes, in the first 6-8 weeks of the semester, with a GPA below a 2.5, to attend a 2 hour study session per week where they discuss study skills, leadership opportunities, and time management skills.

CSC President Rhine noted that CSC had received notification from the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) confirming participation in the Open Pathway model for accreditation. This model focuses on continuous improvement. The initiative is related to the review of, and changes to, CSC's central studies program.

President Rhine further noted the construction projects are underway including Phase I of the Rangeland Center, Eagle Ridge and Armstrong Gymnasium.

Student Trustees' Reports

PSC Student Trustee, Joseph Fauver, reported on various activities that were scheduled for the remainder of the spring semester. He also announced that he had been accepted into the Ph.D. program at Colorado State University in microbiology, pathology and parasitology. Student Trustee Fauver thanked the Board for the opportunity to serve.

CSC Student Trustee, Morgan Nelson, reported on various activities that had occurred and were scheduled for the spring semester. She also announced she had been accepted into the graduate programs in government and public policy at Texas A&M. She also thanked the Board for allowing her to serve as student trustee for Chadron State.

WSC Student Trustee, Madison Becker, reported on various activities that had occurred during the spring semester and some of the upcoming events. Becker said she was pleased that she would be serving on the Board again next year.

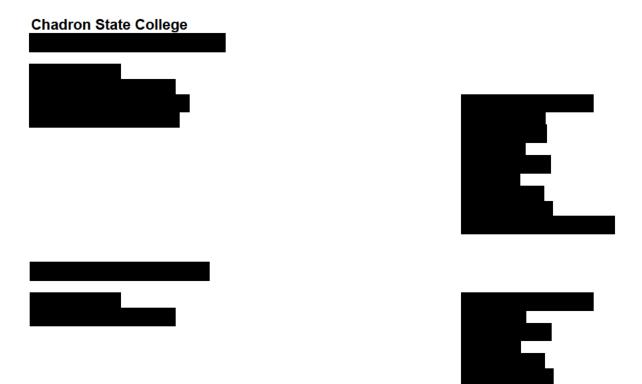

BOARD POLICY

Faculty shall be issued annual contracts specifying salary and other terms and conditions of employment in accordance with the policies identified below on the contract form approved by the System Office. The contracts must be signed by the President or Chancellor and be reported to the Board.

Appointments to teaching, research, or other faculty positions shall be identified as either tenurable or non-tenurable.

EMPLOYMENT TERMS

- a. Tenurable appointments shall be identified as either "Probationary/Tenure Track Appointments" or "Tenured Appointments".
- b. Non-tenurable faculty appointments shall be identified as "Specific Term Appointments" or as "Special Appointments." A "Specific Term Appointment" shall carry no presumption of reappointment and will expire at the end of the stated term, if notice is given in the time and manner prescribed in Board Policy 5014. Special Appointments carry no presumption of reappointment and shall terminate in accordance with the time stated in the written contract.
- c. Appointments at less than full-time or joint appointments of two or more individuals to a single position shall not be tenurable appointments.
- d. Service in non-tenurable appointments shall not count towards probationary service for tenure.
- e. An appointment not specifically identified as tenurable is a non-tenurable appointment. A tenured appointment not specifically identified as tenured is probationary.
- f. Colleges shall not include any employment warranties or other special conditions in employment contracts in violation of Board Policies or the SCEA bargaining agreement.

PROCEDURE

- 1. Each State College may establish policies for non-tenurable appointees regarding other faculty rights and responsibilities, including voting. Such policies may recognize different classes of non-tenurable appointments such as adjunct faculty, visiting faculty, or lecturer, etc.
- The contract of employment for non tenurable appointees shall specify the term of the appointment. In the
 event the term is not specified in the contract, the term is considered to be the semester during which
 employment first occurs.
- The initial employment contract for tenurable appointees shall also specify the standards and procedures to be applied in any tenure decision.

BOARD POLICY

Professional staff holding regular, full time budgeted positions shall be issued contracts on the contract form approved by the System Office specifying salary and other terms of employment which must be signed by the President or Chancellor, and reported to the Board. The contract shall contain the following, and may contain additional mutually agreed upon terms:

- 1. Identification of the type of appointment, either a "Special Appointment," or a "Specific Term Appointment" as defined by Board Policy 5014;
- A statement that the rights and responsibilities, specified in Sections 2000 and 5000 of Board policies, are
 a part of the contract; and
- 3. Identification of the position title, term of employment, salary, employee benefits, collective bargaining unit status, and, where applicable, the termination date of the appointment.

Colleges shall not include any employment warranties or other special conditions in employment contracts in violation of Board Policies or the NSCPA Bargaining Agreement.

As of 6.1 2008, professional staff members who hold a contract that includes a term regarding the right to retain tenure and/or the right to return to faculty status shall retain such right for a period of four (4) years during which time they can exercise the right, as long as he or she remains employed by the College. During the four (4) year period, if a vacant faculty position at the employing College occurs for which the professional staff member is qualified; the College may offer the vacant position to the professional staff member in writing. Qualifications will be determined by the College. If the professional staff member does not accept the vacant faculty position, he or she will be deemed to have relinquished all future rights to return to a faculty position and/or tenured faculty employment.

At the end of four (4) years, a professional staff member may remain in their non faculty appointment according to the terms of employment found in the NSCPA Bargaining Agreement and/or applicable Board Policies but shall relinquish all future rights to return to a faculty position and/or tenured faculty employment. In the event a professional staff member exercises a right to return to a faculty position and/or tenured faculty employment in a timely manner, he or she will be employed according to the terms of the current SCEA Bargaining Agreement and/or applicable Board Policies.

Consistent with the terms outlined above, professional staff members hired from College faculty positions after 6 1-2008 may contractually be allowed to retain a right to retain tenure and/or the right to return to faculty status for a period of four (4) years.

At a President's approval and subsequent request to the Chancellor, an extension of the four (4) year time period may be granted by the Chancellor due to extenuating circumstances.

POLICY: 5014 Types of Employment Appointments;

Page 1 of 3

BOARD POLICY

Faculty and professional staff shall be issued annual contracts specifying salary and other terms and conditions of employment in accordance with Board policies and/or applicable collective bargaining agreements on the contract form approved by the System Office. Employment contracts must be signed by the President or Chancellor and be reported to the Board. Employment warranties or other special conditions in employment contracts that violate Board Policies or collective bargaining agreements shall not be allowed.

Each person appointed to a faculty or professional staff position shall be designated as having one of the following types of appointments:

- 1. **Special Appointment.** Appointments that are not "Specific Term Appointments," "Probationary/Tenure Track Appointments," or "Tenured Appointments," shall be "Special Appointments." The following types of appointments to faculty or professional staff positions shall be filled by Special Appointment only:
 - a. Temporary or interim appointments for less than one (1) academic <u>or fiscal</u> year;
 - b. Appointments to part-time positions;
 - c. Appointments to volunteer status;
 - d. Appointments to the rank of assistant instructor, lecturer, or "visiting" academic faculty rank;
 - e. Appointments of graduate assistants (up to an academic <u>or fiscal</u> year); and,
 - f. Appointments supported by funds over which the College does not have control or which the College cannot reasonably expect to continue indefinitely.

A "Special Appointment" shall terminate in accordance with the time stated in the written contract or with ninety (90) days written notice by either party. If no time is stated in the written contract, the appointment may be terminated by either party giving the other at least ninety (90) days written notice of the date of termination. Special Appointments may also be terminated prior to the expiration of the contract term for adequate cause, discontinuance, reduction or curtailment of a program or department, or financial exigency according to Board Policies. No advance notice shall be required in the event of dismissal for cause prior to the end of the appointment term.

Every "Special Appointment" is a non-tenure, <u>non-ranked</u> position and carries no presumption of reappointment beyond the termination date. Time in a special appointment position shall not count toward years of service in qualifying for a tenured appointment or promotion in rank.

A member of the faculty <u>or professional staff</u> may hold a "Special Appointment" coincident with a "Specific Term Appointment," <u>"Probationary/Tenure Track Appointment,"</u> or a "Tenured Appointment," and the terms of the "Special Appointment" may be independent of the terms of the other appointment status as a faculty member.

2. **Specific Term Appointment**. A "Specific Term Appointment" is a professional staff or faculty appointment for a term of one academic or fiscal year. <u>Faculty appointments will be designated as either "Probationary/Tenure Track Appointment," "Tenured Appointment," or "Non-Tenure Track Appointment." No advance notice shall be required in the event of dismissal for cause prior to the end of the appointment term.</u>

The Chancellor has the discretion to offer Vice Chancellors" Specific Term "contracts for a period of two (2) years with a salary level which is determined annually. Contracts may be renewed at the discretion of

the Chancellor. Such renewal shall be for an additional one (1) year period with a salary level determined for the upcoming year. Written notice of non-renewal shall be given by June 30 prior to the final contract year. No advance notice shall be required in the event of dismissal for cause <u>prior to the end of the appointment term</u>.

A "Specific Term Appointment" for faculty members shall be a non tenure track appointment and shall not count toward years of service in qualifying for a tenured appointment or promotion in rank. Faculty appointed to a "Specific Term" professional staff position do not have tenured status with respect to such position, the salary of the position, the term (AY/FY) of contract, or any other provisions or perquisites of that position.

Reappointment and non-renewal notice requirements for faculty covered by the SCEA bargaining unit are contained in the current NSCS-SCEA Bargaining Agreement.

Reappointment and non-renewal notice requirements for professional staff covered by the NSCPA bargaining unit are contained in the current NSCS-NSCPA Bargaining Agreement.

Non-union faculty or non-union professional staff specific term appointments A "Specific Term Appointment" shall carry no presumption of reappointment, and will terminate at the end of the stated term, if written notice of non-reappointment is given in accordance with the following requirements:

- a. Written notice of intent not to renew appointments shall be given at least thirty (30) days prior to expiration during the first year of employment, three (3) months prior to expiration during the second year of employment, or six (6) months prior to expiration during the third or subsequent years of employment in a full-time position. For purposes of determining non-renewal notice periods, years of employment refer to years of employment in specific term appointments. Specific Term Appointments may also be terminated prior to expiration of the contract term for adequate cause, discontinuance, reduction or curtailment of a program or department, or financial exigency according to Board Policies.
- b. A written notice of intent not to renew may shall be signed by the department chair, immediate supervisor, Dean or Director, President, Chancellor or the Chair of the Board of Trustees. Notice shall be deemed to have been properly given by personal delivery or if mailed to the employee's home address, as reflected by the records of the College or System Office, by certified mail with sufficient postage attached.
- c. Failure to provide the required notice period shall not result in automatic reappointment or create any right to reappointment for an additional term. The employer shall have the option of providing employment or severance pay in lieu of any portion or all of the notice to which the employee is entitled, so long as the extension of employment or severance pay is commensurate with the notice to which the employee is otherwise entitled.

Tenured faculty members who accept an employment appointment to a professional staff position may be contractually granted the right to return to his or her tenured faculty position, at the discretion of the President, for a maximum of two (2) years. If the President offers such a right to return in an employment contract, the College shall only be allowed to refill the faculty vacancy with interim appointments until the right to return period has expired. As of 6 1 2008, professional staff members who hold a contract that includes a term regarding the right to retain tenure and/or the right to return to faculty status shall retain such right for a period of four (4) years during which time they can exercise the right, as long as he or she remains employed by the College. During the four (4) year period, if a vacant faculty position at the employing College occurs for which the professional staff member is qualifications will be determined by the College. If the professional staff member does not exercise the right to return to his or her tenured faculty position within the two (2) year period, accept the vacant faculty position, he or she will be deemed to have relinquished all future rights to return to a faculty position and/or tenured faculty employment.

At the end of four (4) years, a professional staff member may remain in their non faculty appointment according to the terms of employment found in the NSCPA Bargaining Agreement and/or applicable Board Policies but shall relinquish all future rights to return to a faculty position and/or tenured faculty employment. In the event a professional staff member exercises a right to return to a faculty position and/or tenured faculty employment in a timely manner, he or she will be employed according to the terms of the current SCEA Bargaining Agreement and/or applicable Board Policies.

A "Probationary/Tenure Track Appointment" shall carry no presumption of renewal, and will terminate at the end of the stated term, if written notice of non reappointment is given in accordance with the terms of the SCEA Bargaining Agreement.
- 4. Tenured Appointment. A "Tenured Appointment" is an academic appointment terminable only for adequate cause; program or department reduction, curtailment or discontinuance, or financial exigency. No person shall have a "Tenured Appointment" until notice has been received that such an appointment has been reported to and accepted by the Board. The President shall inform the Chancellor if the recommendations of the President and the Academic Vice President differ from the recommendations of the College Promotion and Tenure Committee and dean.

The Agreement is similar to the PHEAST Agreement that was approved in 2011 and other long standing RHOP collaborative partnerships. The College and System Office recommend approval of the Agreement.

As part of the Agreement on the biennium operating budget (LB 195 (2013)) between the Governor, Legislature, and the NSCS, tuition rates will not be increased for 2013-14 or 2014-15. The rates shown above for tuition remain the same as in 2012-13. The new non-resident rate for Chadron State College is added in accordance with action taken by the Board at its March 15, 2013 meeting.

Board policy 6021 states that undergraduate resident tuition rates will be established, and the graduate rate will be approximately one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of the

undergraduate rate. Non-resident undergraduate rates will be established at no more than two hundred percent (200%) of resident undergraduate rates, and non-resident graduate rates will be established at approximately one hundred twenty- five percent (125%) of the non-resident undergraduate rate.

Since the original plan, there has been a shift in the allocation of fencing and earthwork between the two projects. To properly allocate the Colleges' funding for the projects as they are now divided, the College also requests permission to move \$345,000 from the cash allocation approved in January, 2013 for the football project to the soccer field project. There is no change in total cost for the two projects. This simply aligns the funding with the designated contracts.

The first is the addition of South Dakota residents as eligible for the Midwestern Higher Education Compact tuition rate of 150% of the resident rate. This change will impact South Dakota residents attending Wayne State College and will allow the College to compete more vigorously for South Dakota students who might be interested in attending Wayne State.

The second revision is to add the new non-resident rate at Chadron State College in accordance with action taken by the Board at its March 15, 2013 meeting.

The System Office recommends approval of the revisions to Board Policy 6021 and a copy is attached.

BOARD POLICY

The Board shall fix and collect tuition for resident, non-resident, undergraduate and graduate students who matriculate at the Colleges. The Board shall also fix and collect an online rate for online courses.

PROCEDURE

The following guidelines will be used in establishing tuition rates:

- 1. The Board will advocate sufficient funding from the state to maintain affordable tuition so more citizens can avail themselves of the opportunity to attend college.
- Factors which may be considered in establishing undergraduate resident rates will include, but not be limited to, availability of general funds, resource requirements of the Colleges, peer comparisons, consumer price index, higher education price index, availability of financial assistance and changes in regional per capita income.
- 3. Tuition rates should reflect the higher cost of graduate instruction. Graduate tuition will be set at approximately 125 percent (125%) of the undergraduate rate.
- 4. In recognition of the value of a diverse student population and the fact that the Colleges' service regions extend beyond the Nebraska borders, out-of-state undergraduate tuition will not exceed 200 percent (200%) of undergraduate resident tuition.
- 5. Graduate non-resident tuition will be set at approximately 125 percent (125%) of undergraduate non-resident tuition.
- 6. Non-resident Scholars' tuition rate shall be 100 percent (100%) of the resident rate.
- 7. The Midwestern Higher Education Compact tuition rate shall be 150 percent (150%) of the resident rate.
- 8. Iowa and South Dakota residents will be eligible for the Midwestern Higher Education Compact tuition rate.
- 9. The "One Rate Any State" tuition rate for undergraduate, non-resident, on-site students at Peru State College is one dollar (\$1.00) above the undergraduate, resident rate.
- 10. The "Eagle Rate" tuition rate for undergraduate, non-resident, on-site students at Chadron State College is one dollar (\$1.00) above the undergraduate, resident rate.
- 110. The "Bridge" tuition program at the College Center in South Sioux City for undergraduate and graduate onsite students is one dollar (\$1.00) above the undergraduate and graduate resident rates, respectively.

The following guidelines will be used in establishing online rates:

- 1. The online rate will be inclusive of tuition and fees. In addition, every student who matriculates to any College for the first time shall pay a matriculation fee.
- 2. There will be one rate for undergraduate and one rate for graduate online courses. The graduate rate will be set at approximately 125 percent (125%) of the undergraduate rate.

FISCAL OPERATIONS, NEBRASKA STATE COLLEGE SYSTEM

POLICY: 6021 Income; Tuition, Online Rate, and Dual Enrollment Rate

- 3. Each College will establish a distribution formula for the one-rate, which must be approved by the Chancellor. Funds distributed outside of the cash fund per credit hour shall not exceed the equivalent of on-campus student fees credited to that fund. The distribution formula must include funding for the Capital Improvement Fee at the current approved rate.
- 4. Period enrollment reports will include enrollments in online courses.

The following guidelines will be used in establishing the dual enrollment program rate:

- 1. The dual enrollment rate will be inclusive of tuition and fees. In addition, every student who matriculates to any College for the first time shall pay a matriculation fee.
- 2. The only fee required for dual enrollment courses is the Capital Improvement Fee.
- 3. Each College will assure credit to the Capital Improvement Fee of the current approved rate for the fee, which fee is included in the dual enrollment rate.

REVENUE BOND - AUXILIARY OPERATIONS, NEBRASKA STATE COLLEGE SYSTEM

POLICY: 9006 Revenue Bonds; Use of Surplus Funds Page 1 of 2

BOARD POLICY

The Surplus Funds on each campus are those funds remaining each year after costs of operations and maintenance have been paid and after the required minimum dollar amounts have been deposited into the various other bond funds at the end of the fiscal year. The Surplus Fund shall be drawn upon first to make up any deficiencies in the Bond Fund and/or the Bond and Interest Reserve Funds. The Surplus Fund may then be used, upon approval of the Board, to complete the Costs of Construction or Acquisition of any Improvement in the event the funds on deposit in the Construction Fund are not adequate; to pay the Costs of Construction or Acquisition of additional buildings and facilities appropriate to be purchased with revenue bond funds; and to make any extraordinary repairs, renewals, replacements, renovations, equippings, and furnishings to the revenue bond facilities of which all or part of the revenue, fees and earnings are derived from the operations and which are pledged under the revenue bond resolution to payment on the debt of the facilities. These extraordinary items are those which are not customarily included as costs of operation and maintenance and which are deemed necessary or desirable by the Board in order to maintain such revenues, fees and earnings or to maintain the facilities as a revenue-producing enterprise. It is the Board of Trustees' intent that the minimum balance to be maintained in the Surplus Funds at each of the State Colleges shall be 7.5% of the outstanding debt; however, in no circumstance shall any of the colleges' Surplus Funds be drawn down below two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000).

Before an expenditure exceeding <u>five hundred thousand dollars</u> (\$500,000) for any one item can be initiated, and subsequent to Board approval, the Chancellor will submit such project to the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education and to the Legislature for approval as required by law.

PROCEDURE

An annual Contingency Maintenance Request for extraordinary repair items shall be submitted to the System Office in the format and according to the schedule developed by the System Office. The request material shall be reviewed by the Board's revenue bond financial management consultant and Vice Chancellor for Finance & Administration, and a recommendation submitted by them to the Board. The projects being requested are authorized to be initiated at the beginning of the subsequent fiscal year and expenditures for them are to be transacted after July 1 of that new fiscal year. An exception to this procedure is granted for those projects that must be completed during the subsequent summer months. The colleges Colleges are authorized to begin planning and design activities and to place purchase orders for such Contingency Maintenance projects as soon as the Board has approved the requests. However, no payments shall be made on those projects until after July 1 of the request year. Approved projects will be initiated and completed within three (3) years of the resolution's applicable fiscal year period. Projects that have not been initiated within that time period shall be closed out and Surplus Fund balances earmarked for those specific projects shall be reclassified as uncommitted Surplus Funds. Designated funds may continue to be earmarked for those projects that have been initiated within the three-year period but, due to extraordinary circumstances, have not been completed and payment made to the vendor.

Periodically it may be necessary to expend Surplus Funds on an emergency-type project. The System Office should be notified and the College may proceed with the project, after approval is given by the Chancellor and the Fiscal, and Facilities and Audit Subcommittee Chair. Such approvals shall be reported to the Board at the subsequent meeting.

If any contingency maintenance item approved by the Board exceeds it's estimated cost, the College may reallocate up to <u>one thousand dollars (\$1,000)</u> in fund balances from other completed projects and report same to the System Office.

REVENUE BOND - AUXILIARY OPERATIONS, NEBRASKA STATE COLLEGE SYSTEM

If any fund balances remain from completed Contingency Maintenance projects, the College may expend up to \$5,000 twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) of those funds for additional, related projects, after consultation with System Office staffonce approved by the Chancellor. Such reallocation shall be reported to the Board in the subsequent Contingency Maintenance Progress Report. Reallocations exceeding \$5,000 twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be submitted to the Board for approval prior to initiating the projects using those funds.

Intercollegiate Athletics Report of Institutional Commitment to NCAA Principles for Conduct to Enhance Integrity in Intercollegiate Athletes for Chadron and Wayne State Colleges

Priority: Educational Excellence

The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) requires Division II member institutions to complete the NCAA Institutional Self-Study Guide (ISSG) to enhance integrity in intercollegiate athletics. The purposes of the ISSG are to:

- Sensitize top administrators and key campus constituencies of NCAA Division II
 member institutions to major types of problems that commonly occur in
 intercollegiate athletics programs.
- 2. Identify specific areas in their own athletics programs that may represent potential problems and develop written plans for improvement for those areas, and
- Guide institutions toward review of documentation to support selected areas of study and, as necessary, actions that might prevent or minimize the severity of identified problems.

In compliance with their respective institutional self-studies, Chadron State College and Wayne State College declare their commitment to the attached Principles for Conduct of Intercollegiate Athletics as specified for Division II member institutions in NCAA Constitution Two.

2.01 GENERAL PRINCIPLE [*]

Legislation enacted by the Association governing the conduct of intercollegiate athletics shall be designed to advance one or more basic principles, including the following, to which the members are committed. In some instances, a delicate balance of these principles is necessary to help achieve the objectives of the Association.

2.1 THE PRINCIPLE OF INSTITUTIONAL CONTROL AND RESPONSIBILITY [*]

- **2.1.1 Responsibility for Control.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to control its intercollegiate athletics program in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Association. The institution's president or chancellor is responsible for the administration of all aspects of the athletics program, including approval of the budget and audit of all expenditures. (*Revised: 10/3/05*)
- **2.1.2 Scope of Responsibility.** [*] The institution's responsibility for the conduct of its intercollegiate athletics program includes responsibility for the actions of its staff members and for the actions of any other individual or organization engaged in activities promoting the athletics interests of the institution.

2.2 THE PRINCIPLE OF STUDENT-ATHLETE WELL-BEING [*]

Intercollegiate athletics programs shall be conducted in a manner designed to protect and enhance the physical and educational well-being of student-athletes.

- **2.2.1 Overall Educational Experience.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish and maintain an environment in which a student-athlete's activities are conducted as an integral part of the student-athlete's educational experience. (*Adopted: 1/10/95*)
- **2.2.2 Cultural Diversity and Gender Equity.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish and maintain an environment that values cultural diversity and gender equity among its student-athletes and intercollegiate athletics department staff. (Adopted: 1/10/95)
- **2.2.3 Health and Safety.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to protect the health of and provide a safe environment for each of its participating student-athletes. (Adopted: 1/10/95)
- **2.2.4 Student-Athlete/Coach Relationship.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish and maintain an environment that fosters a positive relationship between the student-athlete and coach. (*Adopted: 1/10/95*)
- **2.2.5 Fairness, Openness and Honesty.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to ensure that coaches and administrators exhibit fairness, openness and honesty in their relationships with student-athletes. (Adopted: 1/10/95)
- **2.2.6 Student-Athlete Involvement.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to involve student-athletes in matters that affect their lives. (*Adopted: 1/10/95*)

2.3 THE PRINCIPLE OF GENDER EQUITY [*]

- **2.3.1 Compliance With Federal and State Legislation.** [*] It is the responsibility of each member institution to comply with federal and state laws regarding gender equity. (Adopted: 1/11/94)
- **2.3.2 NCAA Legislation.** [*] The Association should not adopt legislation that would prevent member institutions from complying with applicable gender-equity laws, and should adopt legislation to enhance member institutions' compliance with applicable gender-equity laws. (Adopted: 1/11/94)
- **2.3.3 Gender Bias.** [*] The activities of the Association should be conducted in a manner free of gender bias. (*Adopted: 1/11/94*)

2.4 THE PRINCIPLE OF SPORTSMANSHIP AND ETHICAL CONDUCT [*]

For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, student-athletes, coaches, and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifest not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each institution to: (Revised: 1/9/96)

- (a) Establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution; and (Adopted: 1/9/96)
- (b) Educate, on a continuing basis, all constituencies about the policies in Constitution 2.4-(a). (Adopted: 1/9/96)

2.5 THE PRINCIPLE OF SOUND ACADEMIC STANDARDS [*]

Intercollegiate athletics programs shall be maintained as a vital component of the educational program, and student-athletes shall be an integral part of the student body. The admission, academic standing and academic progress of student-athletes shall be consistent with the policies and standards adopted by the institution for the student body in general.

2.6 THE PRINCIPLE OF NONDISCRIMINATION [*]

The Association shall promote an atmosphere of respect for and sensitivity to the dignity of every person. It is the policy of the Association to refrain from discrimination with respect to its governance policies, educational programs, activities and employment policies, including on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, national origin, race, religion, creed or sexual orientation. It is the responsibility of each member institution to determine independently its own policy regarding nondiscrimination. (Adopted: 1/16/93, Revised: 1/11/00)

2.7 THE PRINCIPLE OF DIVERSITY WITHIN GOVERNANCE STRUCTURES [*]

The Association shall promote diversity of representation within its various divisional governance structures and substructures. Each divisional governing body must assure gender and ethnic diversity among the membership of the bodies in the division's administrative structure. (Adopted: 1/9/96 effective 8/1/97)

2.8 THE PRINCIPLE OF RULES COMPLIANCE

- **2.8.1 Responsibility of Institution.** [*] Each institution shall comply with all applicable rules and regulations of the Association in the conduct of its intercollegiate athletics programs. It shall monitor its programs to assure compliance and to identify and report to the Association instances in which compliance has not been achieved. In any such instance, the institution shall cooperate fully with the Association and shall take appropriate corrective actions. Members of an institution's staff, student-athletes, and other individuals and groups representing the institution's athletics interests, shall comply with the applicable Association rules, and the member institution shall be responsible for such compliance.
- **2.8.2 Responsibility of Association.**[*] The Association shall assist the institution in its efforts to achieve full compliance with all rules and regulations and shall afford the institution, its staff and student-athletes fair procedures in the consideration of an identified or alleged failure in compliance.
- **2.8.3 Penalty for Noncompliance.** [*] An institution found to have violated the Association's rules shall be subject to such disciplinary and corrective actions as may be determined by the Association.

2.9 THE PRINCIPLE OF AMATEURISM [*]

Student-athletes shall be amateurs in an intercollegiate sport, and their participation should be motivated primarily by education and by the physical, mental and social benefits to be derived. Student participation in intercollegiate athletics is an avocation, and student-athletes should be protected from exploitation by professional and commercial enterprises.

2.10 THE PRINCIPLE OF COMPETITIVE EQUITY [*]

The structure and programs of the Association and the activities of its members shall promote opportunity for equity in competition to assure that individual student-athletes and institutions will not be prevented unfairly from achieving the benefits inherent in participation in intercollegiate athletics.

2.11 THE PRINCIPLE GOVERNING RECRUITING [*]

The recruiting process involves a balancing of the interests of prospective student-athletes, their educational institutions and the Association's member institutions. Recruiting regulations shall be designed to promote equity among member institutions in their recruiting of prospective student-athletes and to shield them from undue pressures that may interfere with the scholastic or athletics interests of the prospective student-athletes or their educational institutions.

2.12 THE PRINCIPLE GOVERNING ELIGIBILITY [*]

Eligibility requirements shall be designed to assure proper emphasis on educational objectives, to promote competitive equity among institutions and to prevent exploitation of student-athletes.

2.13 THE PRINCIPLE GOVERNING FINANCIAL AID [*]

A student-athlete may receive athletically related financial aid administered by the institution without violating the principle of amateurism, provided the amount does not exceed the cost of education authorized by the Association; however, such aid as defined by the Association shall not exceed the cost of attendance as published by each institution. Any other financial assistance, except that received from one upon whom the student-athlete is naturally or legally dependent, shall be prohibited unless specifically authorized by the Association. (Revised: 1/9/96)

2.14 THE PRINCIPLE GOVERNING PLAYING AND PRACTICE SEASONS [*]

The time required of student-athletes for participation in intercollegiate athletics shall be regulated to minimize interference with their opportunities for acquiring a quality education in a manner consistent with that afforded the general student body.

2.15 THE PRINCIPLE GOVERNING POSTSEASON COMPETITION AND CONTESTS SPONSORED BY NONCOLLEGIATE ORGANIZATIONS [*]

The conditions under which postseason competition occurs shall be controlled to assure that the benefits inherent in such competition flow fairly to all participants, to prevent unjustified intrusion on the time student-athletes devote to their academic programs, and to protect student-athletes from exploitation by professional and commercial enterprises.

2.16 THE PRINCIPLE GOVERNING THE ECONOMY OF ATHLETICS PROGRAM OPERATION [*]

Intercollegiate athletics programs shall be administered in keeping with prudent management and fiscal practices to assure the financial stability necessary for providing student-athletes with adequate opportunities for athletics competition as an integral part of a quality educational experience.

Operationalize Background Screening Protocols

Priority: Financial Strength of the System

This item is an action item included on the Academic and Personnel Committee's agenda. It is also included for information for the Fiscal, Facilities & Audit Committee because it relates to insurance.

As part of the renewal process for our general liability and umbrella liability policies, our insurer is requiring that we conduct additional background screenings on employees and volunteers. The Board is requested to authorize the Chancellor to move forward with necessary actions to implement the additional requirements to assure the NSCS is able to continue existing coverage.

Chancellor's Report

1. Legislative Update

The Legislature completed its regular 2013 session, adjourning on Wednesday, June 5. As you know, it was a very good session for us with positive results on the budget, allowing implementation of the proposed two year tuition freeze. In addition, the capital construction bill provided very positive results for the NSCS, which I'll discuss just below. We'll be working to determine and/or implement the impact on the NSCS of several bills, including issues related to contract management, waiver of fees for dependents of deceased or disabled veterans, state financial aid programs, and reciprocity agreements.

2. Capital Construction

The Capital Construction (LB198) bill included several items for the NSCS. As you know, the legislation included funding to allow the NSCS Facilities Corporation to bond for the Wayne State College U.S. Conn Library renovation project and the Chadron State College Rangeland Center Phase II construction. LB198 includes \$2,216,000 million for each year of the biennium with intent language to continue that amount in future biennium budgets through June 30, 2021.

The bill also includes reaffirmation of the state's commitment of \$1,125,000 per year toward the payment on the LB605 (2006) bonds. It includes appropriation authority for the NSCS's share of that payment, which comes from Capital Improvement Fee funds, and also provides the appropriation authority for other Capital Improvement Fee projects approved by the Board.

The bill continues the language from the previously funded Chadron State College Armstrong renovation project and the Peru State College Oak Bowl project.

Finally, the bill contains the NSCS appropriation for the first transfers of funds to the NSCS for the Sports Facilities Cash Fund. You may recall that the Board approved the first group of projects at its November 16, 2012 meeting. The first \$250,000 will be available July 1, 2013 and the next \$250,000 October 1, 2013, with another \$250,000 available October 1, 2014. Beginning October 1, 2015, the annual transfer increases to \$400,000.

3. Insurance Renewal Update

Work continues on insurance renewals. We have not yet received quotes on our liability and D&O coverage. We have received a "not to exceed" increase from our MHEC property program in the range of 4%. While the program is seeing an overall smaller increase, several claims in the past two years impact the NSCS's rate. Claims are considered in the rate structure for five years following payment of those claims. We will keep you informed as we lock in the other policies.

5. **Board Material Preparation**

Chadron State College President's Report June 2013

I am happy to report that the construction on the Armstrong Gymnasium and Event Center Renovation and Addition and the Coffee Agriculture Pavilion of the Rangeland Complex projects are well underway. Included in this report are recent pictures of the projects as well a photograph of some of the utility work that will serve both the Rangeland Complex and the Eagle Ridge housing project.

Phase one of the Rangeland Complex, the Coffee Agriculture Pavilion, should be completed this August of this year and we are hoping to have the ribbon cutting ceremony in late summer or early fall. With the funding for Phase two of the Rangeland Complex secure, construction on Phase Two of the Rangeland Complex will begin during the spring 2014 semester. Phase two of Rangeland includes the classrooms, plant, soil and animal necropsy laboratories that will support the Rangeland Management program. When complete, the Rangeland Complex will serve the approximately 120 undergraduate students majoring in Rangeland Management.

The Armstrong Gymnasium and Event Center Renovation and Addition will be a significant improvement to our Athletic facilities and put them on par with other schools in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. This project will provide new dressing rooms, weight training space, athletic trainer's space, staff offices, and new arena. The old arena will be retained and used to balance the demands for court time between men's and women's basketball and women's volleyball. The Armstrong renovation and Events Center project should be completed during the spring 2015 semester.

The Eagle Ridge Housing construction project will start this summer and will consist of three units that will house a total of 72 students. Plans call for the project to be complete and available for occupancy by the fall 2014 semester.

Peru State College President's Report June 2013

Student Successes

Student achievement is the heart of Peru State College's mission. Creating an educational environment that encourages student participation and leadership is critical to ensuring that our students are able to draw on their experiences to respond effectively to future challenges. Relevant coursework, undergraduate research and professional development opportunities all play an important role in the education process. By giving our students the tools needed to think critically, we ensure they can compete successfully when they graduate.

For this report, I want to highlight just a few recent successes that demonstrate our commitment to engaged education and highlight our talented students.

Mitch Boshart, a sophomore social science education major from Wood River

Mitch has been honored by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) with its prestigious 2013 Duer Award, a first for Peru State. The award is presented to only one outstanding male and one outstanding female NAIA student-athlete across the nation who best exemplifies character, service, athletic ability and academic excellence.

Mitch is a Board of Trustees Scholar, a member of the college's honors program and a Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete award winner. The three-year letter winner has started on special teams for two years and is a Bobcat Football Elite Team Leader. He also is a TeamMates mentor. In addition to participating in many community service events with his team and in the local community, Mitch has served as the Sports Information Department's radio interviewer in conjunction with KNCY's Bobcat Buzz pre-recorded half-time segments.

Jamie Theye, a senior business, marketing and information technology major from Odell Jamie has been honored by the Campus Compact as a 2013 Newman Civic Fellow. The award honors 181 student leaders from 36 states who have demonstrated a personal commitment to find solutions for challenges facing communities throughout the country. Jamie is Nebraska's only honoree this year. The award is directly attributed to Jamie's work with the Children's Health, Activity and Nutrition Community Engagement (CHANCE) Initiative, which began in 2012 as a partnership with Calvert Elementary School in Auburn focused on improving children's health through nutrition and exercise education. Her role has included instructing weekly classroom activities, participating in community kick-off events, helping lead a culminating event for the first year, and giving presentations locally, regionally and nationally.

Some of Jamie's other civic engagement activities include serving as president of Phi Beta Lambda and as treasurer and media officer for the Peru State Education Association. She has served on many committees that have had an impact on the Peru State campus and the surrounding community, including working for the Scholastic Book Fair, presenting at the annual Dr. Seuss Birthday Bash, serving as chairperson for the Southeast Nebraska Community Action Christmas project, and volunteering with community programs such as Valentines for Vets, Adopt-a-Highway and the Good Samaritan Center.

Rachel Henry, a sophomore sport and exercise science major and business administration/ management minor from Auburn

Rachel developed a partnership between Peru State, the Food Bank of Lincoln and Catholic Social Services of Southeast Nebraska that created a rural mobile food distribution center for one of Nebraska's most food insecure areas, Nemaha County. Rachel started the initiative,

called Feeding 44, when she applied for and was awarded a \$500 Sodexo Foundation Youth Grant. One-hundred grants of up to \$500 were awarded by the Sodexo Foundation to youth-led projects that aim to reduce childhood hunger in local communities throughout America. At the same time, grant winners educate and mobilize their peers around the issue, expanding the pool of people actively searching for solutions to ending childhood hunger.

Rachel is an AmeriCorps Service Scholar, placed first in the Phi Beta Lambda State Leadership Competition and is the only student from Nebraska selected for the University of Nebraska Medical Center's Public Health Early Admission Student Track (PHEAST) program this year.

Tim Oehring, a senior double majoring in elementary education and K-12 special education from Lincoln

Tim, a defensive lineman for the Bobcat football team, was named a Capital One Academic All-America First-Team honoree. He is the third Bobcat football player in history to be honored and the first in 29 years. He is also the only football player from the Heart of America Athletic Conference to be named to the first team. Tim is the past vice president and treasurer of the Council for Exceptional Children, an honors student and a Board of Trustees Scholar. Tim has twice worked as an Americorps National Volunteer, serving in high poverty areas working with special needs students.

Megan Brown, a senior special education and early education major from Syracuse

Megan was recognized by the National Education Association at their Annual Student Program Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C. as Outstanding Local Leader. She was selected for the honor from more than 60,000 members from 1,100 college and university chapters. Megan was recognized last year by the NEA, winning the Jeffrey "J.D." Miller Outstanding Underclassman Award.

Katlyn Donovan, a senior double majoring in K-12 health and physical education and sport and exercise science from Greely

Katlyn was named Physical Education Major of the Year by the Nebraska Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance. She is president of the Physical Education, Activity & Kinesiology Students (PEAKS) of Peru, a member of the Bobcat volleyball team and an NAIA Daktronics Scholar Athlete. Katlyn completed the highly competitive and prestigious Great Plains Public Health Training Center Student Summer Fellowship Program at the University of Nebraska Medical Center's College of Public Health. During the fellowship she assisted rural Nebraska health departments as they educated citizens about cancer prevention and obesity. She developed and implemented plans and activities to respond to areas of need, prepared written reports for accreditation activities, and participated in outreach and case management services for populations with little access to care.

Alexander Wessels, a sophomore business administration marketing and management major from Weeping Water

Alex has been awarded a 2013 Virgil Eihusen Nebraska Business Hall of Fame Scholarship from the Nebraska Chamber of Commerce & Industry. The \$2,500 scholarship is to be used in the 2013-2014 academic year for tuition, room and board, and/or books. The scholarship was created by the State Chamber to provide yearly scholarship assistance to deserving students attending Nebraska colleges or universities and seeking degrees in business-related fields of study. The program is administered through the Nebraska Community Foundation.

While this list of student successes certainly isn't nearly comprehensive, it does provide a glimpse into all of the wonderful ways in which our students are engaging in their education, communities and the state. They are excellent ambassadors for Peru State and the Nebraska State College System and we celebrate their successes. I look forward to seeing the positive impact these students and others like them have throughout their careers.

Wayne State College President's Report June 2013

Wayne State College supports two long-running programs that challenge many of our students to go beyond the normal requirements of the classroom. The Wayne State Honors program and the college's Service-Learning program provide an environment well-suited for students who believe in taking advantage of the opportunities that come with engagement in the learning process. In addition to adding depth to our students' education, both programs regularly receive national recognition.

The Wayne State College Honors Program has no perks or privileges. Unless you count opportunities, the program has none of the trappings for honors students found at many institutions around the country.

Wayne State College Honors students Michelle Anderson, Seth Dallmann, Kimberly Garhart, and Jill Stara presented their Honors projects at the 2012 NCHC convention held in November in Boston, Mass. Anderson, Dallmann, Garhart, and Stara were the only Nebraska Honors students presenting at the 2012 conference. In fact, for four of the past six years, WSC students have been the only students from the state of Nebraska invited to present at the conference.

With more than 300 students in the Honors Program from across nearly every discipline at the college, enrollment in the program has more than doubled since the 2004-05 academic year.

Wayne State honors students often serve as tutors and leaders in student government and cocurricular organizations. The work of WSC honors students is often recognized well beyond our region and state, bringing attention to Wayne State and the quality of education that is available here.

Michelle Anderson's Honors project, supervised by WSC professor Dr. Elise Hepworth, was titled "What All Music Educators Must Know Teaching Music to Students with Special Needs: An Exploration of Instructional Strategies and Common Difficulties." Anderson is the daughter of Keith and Debra Anderson of Villisca, Iowa, and graduated from Corning Community High School. She is majoring in music education.

Kimberly Garhart's Honors project, supervised by WSC professor Dr. David Bohnert, was titled "Orchestral Works by Debussy and Respighi Transcribed for the Modern Wind Band." The daughter of Rodney and Mary Garhart of York, Neb., Kimberly is a graduate of York High School and is majoring in Instrumental Music Education.

Jill Stara's Honors project, supervised by WSC professor Elise Hepworth, was titled "A Survey of Contemporary Disciplinary Strategies to Meet the Needs of Differentiated Learned in the Music Classroom." Jill is the daughter of Kevin and Betsy Stara of David City, Neb., and is majoring in K-12 Music Education.

Seth Dallmann's Honors project, supervised by WSC professor Dr. David Peitz, was titled "Developing Methods to Study Magnetically Controlled Molecular Motors." The son of Mike and Marti Dallmann of Wilber, Seth is a graduate of Wilber-Clatonia High School and is majoring in pre-pharmacy with a chemistry health science concentration. Dallmann's poster was among a small handful of honorees at the conference, through being chosen as the winning poster nationally in the category of Business, Engineering, and Computer Science.

Composed of approximately 900 institutional members, the National Collegiate Honors Council is the primary organization supporting Honors programs at colleges and universities nationwide. The Honors Program at Wayne State College has been a member of the NCHC since 2005, seeking to provide students an in-depth learning environment focusing on discussion, exploration, experimentation, and active learning.

Wayne State College Honors students also were recently cited in the Ninth Edition of the top-selling textbook, *Communication*, published by Pearson Education, Inc.

The textbook integrates a "making connections" theme and emphasizes technology in addition to introducing the basic principles of public speaking, interpersonal communication, and group communication. The text explores the impact of new technologies within communication as well as effects of technology in communication.

The preface of the book thanks students at Clemson University, University of Northern Iowa, University of Nebraska, and Wayne State College for their input, in particular citing the WSC Honors students for providing scenarios and information that was used in the final published version of the text.

The WSC Honors students studied a pre-publication review copy of the text in the course Principles of Communication-Honors, taught by WSC Department of Communication Arts chairperson Dr. Deborah Whitt.

Service-Learning Honor Roll

Wayne State was named to the 2013 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll, marking the third consecutive year the college has been recognized for Service-Learning. This designation is the highest honor a college or university can receive for its commitment to volunteering, service-learning, and civic engagement. Wayne State is one of only 690 institutions of higher education to receive this honor nationally and among seven to be named to the honor roll in Nebraska.

Wayne State College has a long, distinguished history of service to our region and Service-Learning plays an important role in our efforts. We are honored to receive this award and proud of the mark of national distinction that comes with the honor. Much of the credit belongs to the students and faculty who worked so hard outside of their normal class requirements to provide such an important service to Northeast Nebraska.

Lisa Nelson, Service-Learning coordinator at Wayne State, submitted WSC's honor roll application in November 2012. The process entails selecting three service projects as models for Wayne State. More than 1,200 students participated in Service-Learning for this term and provided a total of 16,001 hours of service.

The Service-Learning Advisory Committee selected the Black Light Black Box Theater project guided by Professors Pearl Hansen, Steve Elliot and Gwen Jensen, the Sense of Wonder project led by Professor Barbara Hayford, and the City of Wayne Historic Photo Restoration project guided by Assistant Professor Josh Piersanti and Instructor Matt Hepworth.

The Honors program and the college's Service-Learning initiatives are two of many ways in which Wayne State challenges students to do more than they expect of themselves. The programs build leaders, serve the region and prepare Wayne State graduates for successful careers as professionals and a lifetime of engagement with their communities.
