

Nebraska residents and out-of-state students all have the same low tuition cost.

Estimated Cost to Attend CSC

Tuition	\$2,860 per semester	\$5,720 per year
Fees	\$1,179 per semester	\$2,358 per year
Room	\$2,332 per semester	\$4,664 per year
Meals	\$2,628 per semester	\$5,256 per year
Total	\$8,999 per semester	\$17,998 per year
